COPAS National News

The National COPAS Board and COPAS Office have been busy over the summer. One of the most exciting pieces of news is our new education initiative. In July, after examining a number of options, COPAS entered into a joint venture agreement with MPACT, a division of MartiCons, to develop and provide training courses to COPAS members and the industry. Several courses have already been developed, and are being made available for in-house training, society-sponsored training, training in conjunction with national meetings and courses offered to the members at large. The first joint training session was a Gas Balancing seminar sponsored by the Tulsa Society in August. We're excited about this because it's the first time that COPAS has provided professionally-designed programs to provide training on its own materials. Courses currently available are: Joint Interest Accounting 1 and 2, Revenue Accounting 1 and 2, 2005 Accounting Procedure and Gas Balancing.

A new COPAS Publications Reference Catalog (TR-39) has been prepared which provides a description of each of the Model Form Interpretations, Accounting Guidelines and Training and Reference publications offered by COPAS. It can be downloaded for free at www.copas.org. The on-line store also has a new search engine so that you can enter a search term, and find out the number of occurrences of that term in each COPAS publication. Both of these tools are to help you determine which publication(s) may address your particular issues.

CEPS is seeking contributors. The Computerized Equipment Pricing System is an essential tool for determining equipment pricing chargeable to a joint venture. Greater participation in the survey increases its accuracy and usefulness. Encourage your purchasing department to participate, even if you only purchase limited equipment. If your company has not received a survey (or they have lost it), call the COPAS office.

The Fall national meeting is in Salt Lake City beginning September 22. There are some great activities planned. Activities include an afternoon at Olympic Park in Park City, and a ride on the Olympic bobsled run is part of the offerings. Check it out on the COPAS website.

Tax

Small to mid-size independent petroleum producers or mega oil and gas corporations- they all need to understand the bottom line tax implications of exploration and drilling projects. This uniqueness stems from the fact that Sec. 613A requires that the basis of oil and gas property is held outside of the partnership by each partner and the partner computes depletion, gain and loss independent of the partnership. No other extractive industry. To unravel this byzantine maze, this seminar addresses the common and often intricate transactions faced by oil and gas tax partnerships using a building block approach.
