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## The Benefits of your COPAS-Colorado Membership

COPAS-Colorado provides many benefits to our members and member companies. As we have all seen at our companies, operating costs continue to increase and they continue to increase for COPAS-Colorado as well. Our 2010/2011 membership was approximately 740 members, a 40% increase over the last 5 years. At the March 2011 Board of Directors meeting, the decision was made to increase the annual membership fee by \$50 to \$300 for regular membership and \$200 for regional membership starting with the 2011/2012 membership cycle. The last cost increases took place in 2009 and 2004. We are required to pay a \$60 annual COPAS Assessment to National which is over 20% of our membership fee. This fee is evaluated annually and may increase in the future.



The need to increase fees is due to growing luncheon and facility costs and to manage our organization into the future with prudent fiscal planning. The size of our membership is an asset but the costs continue to increase to accommodate the size of our society.
